31 Jan - 4 February 2011. FAO Mediterranean Projects present at COFI. The FAO Mediterranean Projects, namely AdriaMed, MedSudMed, CopeMed II, EastMed, ArtFiMed,

MedFisis and the GEF-supported Partnership for the Mediterranean (MED-LME), were present during the Committee on Fisheries (COFI) meeting with a joint stand. Documents and products, including posters and

flyers, were available to the participants. The COFI, a subsidiary body of the FAO Council, was established by the FAO Conference at its Thirteenth Session in 1965. The Committee presently constitutes the only global inter-governmental forum where major international fisheries and aquaculture problems and issues are examined and recommendations

addressed to governments, regional fishery bodies, NGOs, fishworkers, FAO and international community, periodically on a world-wide basis. COFI has also been used as a forum in which global agreements and non-binding instruments were negotiated. The 29th Session of COFI took place between 31 January and 4 February 2011. 17 January - 18 February 2011. Training course on direct acoustic methods for the assessment of small pelagic species in the Mediterranean Area at the Oceanographic Centre of Palma de Mallorca The Algerian Government will have a research vessel for the CNRDPA in 2011. From that moment on,

Algerian experts should be able to assess the state of their pelagic resources using direct methods and independent of fisheries. CopeMed II organized a basic theoretical and practical training course to assess small pelagic resources by acoustic methods. The course was organised in collaboration and with the support of the IEO (Spain) and was held at the Oceanographic Centre of Palma de Mallorca. The course

was attended by ten experts from Algeria, Morocco and Tunisia who participated in that course: six CNRDPA (Algeria) experts, two experts from the INRH (Morocco), and two more from INSTM (Tunisia). Professors from the IEO were in charge of the training using standard Mediterranean acoustic methodologies. 1 - 3 February 2011. Monitoring and programming of activities of the Project ArtFiMed in Morocco. Mr M. Bernardon (FAO ArtFiMed and CopeMed II Fishery Officer) conducted a 3-days-mission to Morocco to track and develop the activities of the projects CopeMed II and ArtFiMed in this country. During this mission, he met the Fisheries Delegate of Tangier and the officials of the Chamber of Maritime Fisheries of the Mediterranean to work on various aspects:

During the Meeting, it was agreed that next 2nd of June, ArtFiMed will organise a National Day of the artisanal fisheries in the Mediterranean coast of Morocco in coordination with the national representatives. The general objective of this event is to give more opportunities to the artisanal fisheries and to agree on

priorities that should be considered by the different Administrations.

The Project staff took advantage of this meeting to discuss with the fisheries sector, the Administration, and the INRH experts two important issues: the opportunity to carry out a pilot selectivity experience on the implementation of the 40 mm square mesh size in the trawl gears (GFCM Recommendation) and the SAC recommendations to Morocco and Spain related with the improvement of the data, sampling methodology and the assessment of the Pagellus bogaraveo (voraz) in the Gibraltar Strait area. Some important advances were overtakes, particularly on the definition of the characteristics of the trawl vessel for the selectivity
